Supporting the communities - The ING Foundation Philippines, Inc.

Since 2005, the ING Foundation has introduced a range of programs – shelter, education, environment and livelihood – to improve the welfare of children and communities in the country.

These initiatives are supported by various fundraising efforts including donations from the ING Manila Branch, client organizations and ING employees around the world.

ING Village (Baseco, Tondo) since 2005



ING's flagship project is the ING Village in Baseco, Tondo, Manila, in cooperation with Habitat for Humanity. The project pooled both corporate and personal resources to build and complete what is now a community of 170 houses for the poor families of the locality. The contribution has made ING the single largest buildersponsor in the community.

ING Village (Calauan, Laguna) since 2010



ING Bank celebrated its 20th year in the Philippines with a one-day running event that raised funds to provide shelter to the families who were informal settlers along the Pasig River until they were displaced by Typhoon Ondoy in 2009. The bank, together with Habitat for Humanity, built the ING Village in Calauan, Laguna.

ING Learning Center since 2005



ING runs a community learning center where 150 children receive weekly tutorial lessons from ING volunteers in coordination with World Vision. Two daycare centers were also donated by the bank. The ING Learning Center has produced several elementary students who have graduated with honors.

ING Scholarships since 2010



ING Bank supports access to education by providing scholarships to underprivileged but deserving students from the ING Learning Center. With the help of World Vision, students who have shown great potential in both academics and character are honed to become child leaders and given the chance to pursue their education in high school, college, or post-high school (i.e., technologicalvocational schools).



ING piloted the Orange Bike Project in the Philippines in 2013. The Asia-wide CSR program gave 5,000 underprivileged kids custom-made bicycles. With these Orange Bikes, they no longer have to walk long distances to get to school, thus improving their school attendance and academic performance. ING received the "Top Community Care Companies in Asia" award at the Asia Corporate Excellence and Sustainability Awards 2016, partly in recognition of this project.
